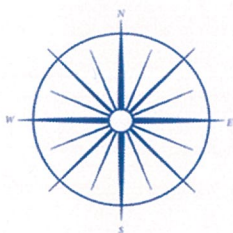

Level 1 School Leaver results include a year 11 student who left in Term 4 but was excluded from the NZQA Principal's Report.

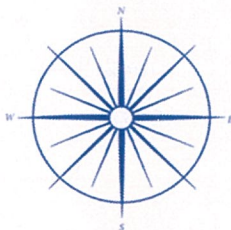

<b>Total school roll (GMR)</b>	210	200
<b>% of student roll that identifies with <u>at least one</u> of the priority learner groups</b>	75%	100%
<b>% of student roll that <u>does not</u> identify with at least one of the priority learner groups</b>	25%	0%
