It left many lwi contemplating their own purpose, growth and development. Consequently, today, I like many others attended the Ngāpuhi Runanga roadshow at Hihiaua, as our own Iwi Runanga endeavour to reset and consider our common future. As whanau of a Kura Māori it is imperative that we work in kotahitanga with each other, within our own whanau, Hāpu and Iwi, for the benefit of our tamariki and mokopuna....that is the endearing message left to us by Kiingi Tuheitia and the proceedings of this week! Which is why I can say:

I love our kaupapa and our panui!!

It shows the mahi and effort continuously put in by staff and ākonga across our Kura....and we see our Kura and our ākonga lifting. It is the hard yards and incessant commitment by ākonga, whanau and staff that enables our Kura to look towards horizons from Paenuku to Paetata to Paetawhiti to Paerangi...."Waiho i te taha katau o te rā, o te marama o kōpū rere ai"
