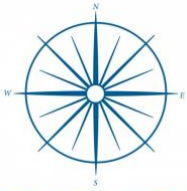
IRONMĀORI Update

Powhiri for new ākonga and staff at Maumahara

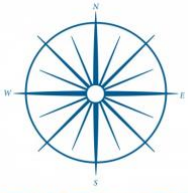
We welcome Matua Neville Tohu to our team.
