Nau mai, hoki mai ki te wāhanga tuatoru o te tau 2025 - kua timata mātou.


I te timata mātou me tētahi powhiri ki tō tātou kura, ki ngā ākonga hou me ngā pouako hou i te Rāhina.


The games take place in Week 8 (August 30 to September 5), more details to follow in the coming weeks.

Term 3 is here, we hope you all had a good break. It was great to see everyone arrive back. Paetawhiti have started the term with a good vibe in the whare.

It has been excellent to see almost everyone in correct uniform, sharp and ready (as Whaea Petina likes to say). Everyone has arrived back with a positive attitude ready to learn and do the mahi.

We appreciate your support with the uniform. The process in arriving with incorrect uniform is to send ākonga to the office to see if there is a spare uniform. If there isn't a call will be made home to bring correct uniform to school. We know that can be hōha, but we hope you will support our efforts to maintain high expectations. 


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PAERANGI
