How our workshops are designed:

Workshops are 1-hour long and can be delivered in-person* or online. The NCEA me te Whānau workshop is delivered in the evening when whānau are available to attend. Ākonga workshops are offered during school hours.

*Note: In-person delivery is subject to the availability of a kaihāpāi (facilitator) in your area or region at the date/time requested.

How to request a workshop:

Once the registration has been received, a member of our team will be in touch to confirm dates and other arrangements.

In Term 4, we will be offering the following workshops:

1. **NCE A-Z** is designed to ensure ākonga are well-prepared for NCEA. This workshop focusses on essential information that ākonga can quickly grasp, instilling confidence within themselves to embark on their NCEA journey.
2. **Tertiary Prep** is designed to ensure ākonga are present to the considerations and decisions they may need to make when considering tertiary study.
3. **NCEA me te Whānau** is designed to assist **parents and caregivers** in supporting their tamaiti. It covers every crucial aspect of NCEA and offers guidance on how to help their tamaiti make informed subject choices.
