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

Together, we ensure that the values of Kia Māori, Kia Mātau, Kia Tū Rangatira Al remains a focal point across Te Kāpehu Whetu.

Programs of Learning:

- **Kaupapa Waka** (Week 1-10) – Facilitator: Joelene Busby. Focus on Māori navigation, teamwork, hoe creation, and cultural traditions.
- **Mahi Tōi Hundertwasser** (Week 1-8) – Facilitator: Jacinda Selman. Weekly art sessions exploring Māori artists and mediums (clay, weaving, tāniko, tessellated patterns).
- **Mau Rākau** (Week 1-8) plus week 8 assessment with Matua Geormas

Literacy:

- Reading Rotations – Guided, independent, shared, reciprocal; exposure to fiction and non-fiction texts.
- Writing & Speaking – Narrative, recount, procedural, report, persuasive, poetry, speech writing.
- Reflective daily journals.
- Explanatory report: whakapapa & significance of kai toi / mahi toi.
- Year 8 Graduation Dinner speech.
- Final published writing piece for the year.
- Oracy – Daily pepeha, karakia, mihi, tauparapara; oral presentations, reflections, mahi toi showcases, graduation speeches.

Assessments & Reporting:

- Week 4, e-asTTle (Literacy, Numeracy, TRM, pānui, tuhituhi). End of year data.
- Week 7, End of year reports issued.
- Week 8, End-of-year writing & math samples collected.

Te Ao Māori Integration:

- Whakarauora Taiao, Environmental sustainability practices.
- Waka Eke Noa, Code of conduct, teamwork, collective responsibility.
- Maramataka, Reflection on annual guidance and future planning.
- Karakia / Whakataukī / Tauparapara, Consolidation of cultural learnings and significance.
