MEASLES PREVENTION

Measles is highly contagious and spreads easily through the air. Symptoms include fever (over 38°C), runny nose, sore red eyes, and a rash starting on the face and spreading to the body.

It affects our most vulnerable whānau – especially pēpi, tamariki under 5, hapū māmā, and those with weakened immune systems.

What You Can Do:

- Be immunised, or get vaccinated: The measles (MMR) vaccination is key to prevention. Not sure if you're up to date? Our nurses can check for you.
- If symptoms appear: Stay home and call Healthline on 0800 611 116.
- Maintain hygiene practices: Wash and sanitise hands, clean shared spaces, and keep fresh air flowing at home & in vehicles.

How our workshops are designed:

Workshops are 1-hour long and can be delivered in-person* or online. The NCEA me te Whānau workshop is delivered in the evening when whānau are available to attend. Ākonga workshops are offered during school hours.

*Note: In-person delivery is subject to the availability of a kaihāpai (facilitator) in your area or region at the date/time requested.

Once the registration has been received, a member of our team will be in touch to confirm dates and other arrangements.

In Term 4, we will be offering the following workshops:

1. **NCE A-Z** is designed to ensure **ākonga** are well-prepared for NCEA. This workshop focusses on essential information that ākonga can quickly grasp, instilling confidence within themselves to embark on their NCEA journey.
2. **Tertiary Prep** is designed to ensure **ākonga** are present to the considerations and decisions they may need to make when considering tertiary study.
3. **NCEA me te Whānau** is designed to assist **parents and caregivers** in supporting their tamaiti. It covers every crucial aspect of NCEA and offers guidance on how to help their tamaiti make informed subject choices.
