


#### MEASLES PREVENTION

It affects our most vulnerable whānau — especially pēpi, tamariki under 5, hapū māmā, and those with weakened immune systems.

#### What You Can Do:

- Be immunised, or get vaccinated: The measles (MMR) vaccination is key to prevention. Not sure if you're up to date? Our nurses can check for you.
- If symptoms appear: Stay home and call Healthline on 0800 611 116.
- Maintain hygiene practices: Wash and sanitise hands, clean shared spaces, and keep fresh air flowing at home & in vehicles.

Workshops are 1-hour long and can be delivered in-person\* or online. The NCEA me te Whānau workshop is delivered in the evening when whānau are available to attend. Ākonga workshops are offered during school hours.

**\*Note:** In-person delivery is subject to the availability of a kaihāpai (facilitator) in your area or region at the date/time requested.
