Kia ora e te whānau. As we reach the half way mark of term 4, we are focusing heavily on gathering progress data of each ākonga.

We have been completing our aromatawai (assessments) for end-of-year reporting and data collection.

Throughout the year, we've used a variety of assessments to understand and support student learning. These include:

- Formative assessments – ongoing learning checks during lessons
- e-asTTle testing in Literacy (Reading and Writing), Numeracy, and Te Reo Māori
- Summative assessments – tasks that give an overview of progress at the end of a topic or term

School Reports will be sent home in Week 7. These reports will reflect a range of evidence for the second half of this year, including:

- Formative and Summative assessments
- OTJs (Overall Teacher Judgements)
- Peer assessments
- e-asTTle results
- Teacher observations and classroom work

KIA ORA WHĀNAU ,

WITH THE WARMER SEASON NOW HERE, HERE ARE SOME COMMON HEALTH CONCERNSTO KEEP AN EYE ON TO ENSURE OUR TAMARIKI STAY HEALTHY AND HAPPY:

- 1 SUNBURN – KURA HATS ARE A MUST AND ARE COMPULSORY IN TERMS 1 AND 4. PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR TAMARIKI HAVE A NAMED HAT. REMEMBER, SUNSCREEN IS ALSO A GREAT WAY TO PROTECT FROM HARMFUL UV RAYS. REAPPLY EVERY COUPLE OF HOURS, ESPECIALLY IF YOUR TAMARIKI ARE PLAYING OUTDOORS OR SWIMMING.**
- 2. DEHYDRATION – STAYING HYDRATED IS KEY. ENSURE YOUR TAMARIKI HAVE A WATER BOTTLE TO KEEP WITH THEM DURING THE DAY, WHICH THEY CAN REFILL AT KURA AS NEEDED. AIM FOR AT LEAST 1-2 BOTTLES OF WATER EACH DAY.**
- 3. KUTU/HEAD LICE – IT IS THAT TIME OF YEAR. IF YOU SPOT HEAD LICE, WE HAVE HEAD LICE SHAMPOO AVAILABLE AT THE OFFICE FOR WHĀNAU. PLEASE CHECK YOUR TAMARIKI HAIR REGULARLY AND TREAT IT IF NECESSARY.**
- 4. SCABIES – IF YOU NOTICE ANY SIGNS OF SCABIES (ITCHING, RED BUMPS), WE CAN HELP WITH LOTION AND FURTHER INFORMATION. PLEASE REACH OUT TO THE OFFICE FOR ADVICE OR ASSISTANCE.**

GP HEALTH & NURSE CHECKS

Free health check-ups & MMR vaccinations to keep you & your tamariki well.

MEASLES PREVENTION

Measles is highly contagious and spreads easily through the air. Symptoms include fever (over 38°C), runny nose, sore red eyes, and a rash starting on the face and spreading to the body.

It affects our most vulnerable whānau – especially pēpi, tamariki under 5, hapū māmā, and those with weakened immune systems.

What You Can Do:

- Be immunised, or get vaccinated: The measles (MMR) vaccination is key to prevention. Not sure if you're up to date? Our nurses can check for you.
- If symptoms appear: Stay home and call Healthline on 0800 611 116.
- Maintain hygiene practices: Wash and sanitise hands, clean shared spaces, and keep fresh air flowing at home & in vehicles.
