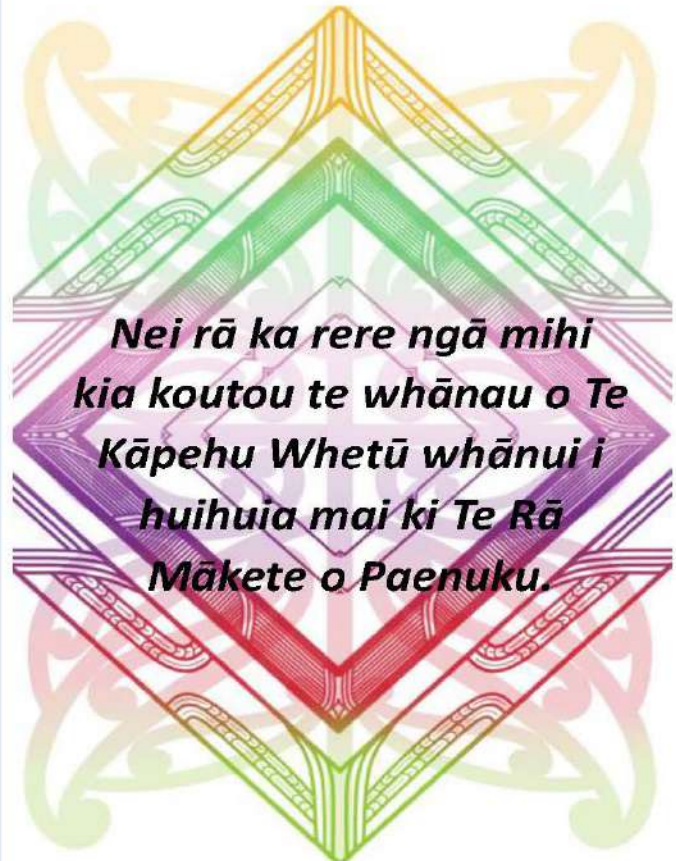

HŌKŪLE'A RETURNS TO AOTEAROA

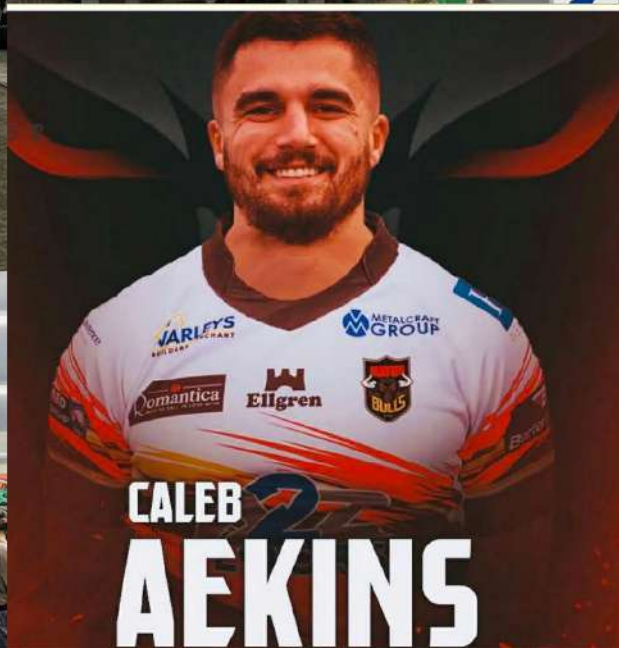
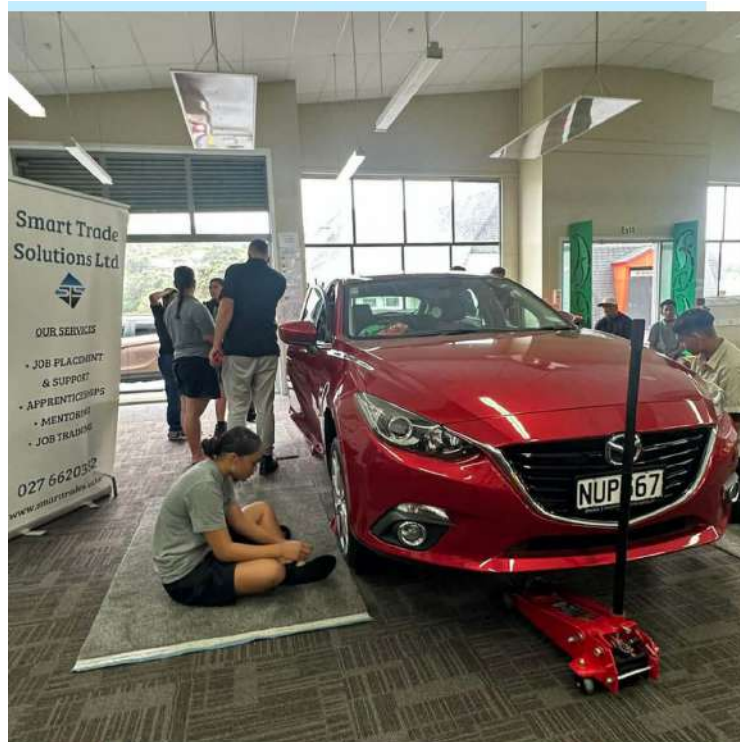
Forty years after its first visit sparked the revival of Māori ocean voyaging, the Hawaiian waka Hōkūle'a returned to Waitangi this Friday as part of its epic four-year voyage around the Pacific.

Whaea Serena and Matua Wiremu took students from Paetata and Paetawhiti up to Waitangi to tautoko the return of Hōkūle'a, in support of Whaea Joelene and the incredible waka kaupapa she has been leading this year across our tuakana whare.

This was a momentous occasion for both the Hawaiian and Aotearoa waka communities, marking a powerful continuation of traditional navigation and cultural revitalisation.
